MISSION STATEMENT

Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten, as an outreach ministry of Cornerstone United Methodist Church, nurtures and develops each child's relationship with God.

We believe that each child is a gift from God, and we are committed to the emotional, physical, mental, social, and spiritual development of each child.

We create a firm foundation in both academic and Christian teaching by being compassionate to each child's needs in a cooperative learning environment that emphasizes love, respect, and sharing.

With Christ as our cornerstone, we strive to foster an early love for learning and a lifelong love for God, Christ, and biblical teachings.

OVERVIEW

Cornerstone Kids is a Christian-based educational program affiliated with Cornerstone United Methodist Church. The school program consists of the program director, administrative staff, teachers, assistant teachers, and classes for one, two, three, and four year old children as well as a kindergarten class. Cornerstone Kids follows a Christian-centered, age-specific curriculum while nurturing the children in a caring environment. Our students, ages two through six, will meet no more than four hours a day. Our one year old students shall not meet more than four hours a day and no more than eight hours a week as defined by the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning.

The school is organized as follows:

The age criteria for each class is as follows:

AGE	CRITERIA
1	One year old on or before September 1 st ; must be able to walk without assistance; eat “table” food; able to drink from a “sippy” cup
2	Two years old on or before September 1 st ; must be able to walk without assistance; eat “table” food; able to drink from a “sippy” cup
3	Three years old on or before September 1 st and potty trained*
4	Four years old on or before September 1 st and potty trained*
K	Five years old on or before September 1 st and potty trained*

We follow the same age requirements as Coweta County Schools. Children may be placed in classes other than these criteria only with the approval of the program director, the child’s parents, and the receiving teacher. This placement would only be considered for placing a child in a younger class and would be appropriate for children with disabilities or other situations that have slowed their development. The Preschool Advisory Committee would resolve any dispute over this placement.

***Potty Trained:** Children must be able to use the bathroom independently, which includes:

- being comfortable asking or identifying when to use the restroom without reminders
- pulling pants up/down independently
- wiping independently.

We understand accidents happen, but frequent or multiple accidents in a day are indications a child is not completely potty trained. Parents will be notified if their child is not regularly in control of his/her bathroom needs.

AGGRESSIVE AND DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR

For the protection of your children, our policy on biting, pushing, hitting, bullying, defiance and any other aggressive and/or disruptive behavior is as follows:

Teachers will be asked to keep records of incidents. If another child shows an act of aggression toward your child, your child’s teacher or the director will notify you. The teacher or director will also notify parents and the Preschool Advisory Committee of children who behave aggressively toward others. If the child exhibits this type of behavior more than three times, the child will need to be removed from the classroom for a period of one week. If this same behavior continues, the child will be removed from the classroom for the remainder of the school year. No refunds will be given.

The same policy applies for any behavior that is aggressive or disruptive to the point that it puts other children’s safety and learning at risk.

Temporary Restriction: Arrival and Dismissal for all children will be done through the car rider lane only. Please do NOT park and walk children to the building.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

Pick-Up and Drop-Off for all children will be done through the car rider lane only. To limit exposure to all (staff, children, and parents), visitors will not be permitted in the building. To ensure the safety of your child, please follow the guidelines. Please refer to the map on p.16.

Teachers are not permitted to hold a conversation with parents during arrival or dismissal. If you need to speak to the teacher or director, please send a note, call or email the preschool office. We will be happy to call you.

All children must have an age-appropriate child seat. Georgia law requires that all children under the age of 8, regardless of height or weight, must be properly secured in an approved car seat or booster seat while riding in an automobile. Each child must be safely buckled into a car seat before departure.

NO CELL PHONE use while in the car rider lanes. We will not release your child to you if



you are using a cell phone or other electronic device. This includes talking, texting, gaming, or reading. Please keep your eyes on the children and teachers at all times. Safety first!

ARRIVAL: Our school day begins at 9:00 a.m. We will begin to unload students from the car rider lane at **8:50 a.m.** We ask your cooperation in not bringing your child to school before this time, as teachers are busy preparing for the day.

- Enter using the Hwy 34 (Bullsboro Dr.) entrance by Waffle House. Drive through the parking lot and enter the car rider lane to the left of the building. There will be only one lane for drop off.
- Put your car in park.
- Please hang your car tag on your rearview mirror.
- **Please keep your child safely buckled and in his/her car seat.** We have had several close calls with children falling out of cars.
- A staff member will take your child's temperature and conduct a health screening.
- A teacher will unbuckle your child and walk your child to his/her classroom.
- For safety reasons, **no cell phone use** while in the car rider lane.
- After dropping off your child, drive straight to the Hwy 154 exit. Right turn only please.

The car rider lane closes at 9:05 a.m. If you arrive after 9:05 a.m., please park in the office lot. Bring your child to the office door and ring the buzzer. Please wait for a CKPK staff member to meet you at the door to walk your child to class.

Temporary Restriction: Arrival and Dismissal for all children will be done through the car rider lane only. Please do NOT park and walk children to the building.

DISMISSAL: We will begin releasing children promptly at 12:00 p.m.* from the Narthex. We ask that you enter the car rider lane no later than 12:10 p.m. The late fee is \$10 for the first five minutes and \$1 a minute will be added for each additional minute you are late. If you know you are going to be late, please call the church office 770-304-9397, if the preschool office 770-683-9780 is unavailable.

*Students in 4B (4-day fours) and Kindergarten are dismissed at 1:00 p.m. M-Th. Kindergarten students dismiss at 12:00 p.m. on Fridays.

- Enter using the Hwy 34 (Bullsboro Dr.) entrance by Waffle House. Drive through the parking lot and enter the car rider lane to the left of the building. There will be two lanes for pick up.
- Put your car in park.
- Please hang your car tag on your rearview mirror. Leave the car tag up until after your child is in the car.
- For safety reasons, **no cell phone use** while in the car rider lane.
- Be prepared to show ID.
- Please stand by the driver's door. A teacher will bring your child to you.
- You are responsible for securing your child in the car seat.
- Please wait to leave, following staff instructions to exit using the Hwy 154 exit.

EARLY DISMISSAL: If there is a need to pick up your child before dismissal, please inform the preschool office 770-683-9780 to let them know what time you will be picking up early. Please park in the office lot. Please ring the buzzer on the office door. A CKPK staff member will bring your child to you and have you fill out the Early Dismissal form. **Students may not be checked out between 11:40 a.m.–12:15 p.m. and no later than 12:40 p.m.**

TRANSPORTATION CHANGES: If someone new/different is picking up your child from school, please send written notice including the name and phone number of the person picking up your child. Please inform them that they will need a picture ID. We will check the ID. If there is ever any question in our minds, we will not release your child until we have contacted you for verification.

WE WILL NOT RELEASE YOUR CHILD TO ANYONE OTHER THAN PARENTS UNLESS WRITTEN PERMISSION IS GIVEN IN ADVANCE. A BAG TAG IS MADE LISTING THOSE AUTHORIZED TO PICK UP YOUR CHILD. ANY ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO THIS TAG MUST BE MADE IN WRITING AND INCLUDE NAME AND PHONE NUMBER.

**** All students will be dismissed at Noon on the last Wednesday of each month to allow for Staff planning. Please refer to the monthly calendar for the dates.**

CERTIFICATION

Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten is certified through the United Methodist Preschool Association of the North Georgia Conference and recognized as “A Program of Excellence for Young Children.”

Temporary Restriction: No parents or visitors will be permitted to attend class parties.

CLASS PARTIES

Class parties are held for Fall, Christmas, Easter, and End of the Year. Room Moms coordinate activities for each classroom. Parents’ participation in class parties is optional. Siblings are welcome to attend and must be supervised by parents.

Due to safety concerns, **balloons, water guns, and glass are not allowed** at parties or on students’ birthdays.

Birthday Celebrations: Parents are welcome to send a special treat (cookie, cupcake, ice cream) for birthday celebrations. Treats must be store-bought. Mini cupcakes, cookies, or individual ice cream cups are preferred. We do not allow knives in the classrooms, so please do not send cakes. We are happy to distribute birthday invitations if the whole class is included in the celebration.

CLOSURE

In the event of a school closure due to inclement weather, natural disaster, public health crisis, etc., tuition will not be refunded if less than a ten school day closure. If a closure is over ten school days, a prorated credit or refund will be issued. Staff will not work or be paid after the 2 week period.

CLOTHING

Children should wear comfortable, washable play clothes and athletic shoes. Flip-flops, sandals, rubber boots, non-rubber soled shoes are not allowed, as they will interfere with your child’s ability and willingness to participate in playtime activities. Children should wear closed-toed, closed-heel, rubber soled shoes with backs (like athletic shoes). For safety purposes, students not wearing appropriate shoes will not be allowed to climb on the playground or play in the Narthex on rainy days. And please wear socks! Mulch in shoes hurts little toes!

Accidents sometimes happen! Please place one change of clothes (shirt, pants, underwear, socks), **labeled** with child’s name, in your child’s backpack. For 1s and 2s, we also ask that you place a minimum of 4 diapers in a **labeled** baggie in the backpack with an ample supply of diaper wipes. If your child is potty training, please pack an extra pair of shoes.

We do play outside daily, weather permitting. In the cold months, please send an appropriate coat, labeled with your child’s name. We will play outside when the temperature is above 40 degrees. **Please label all coats, hats, mittens, etc.** You are welcome to send a hat for your child to wear outside. No sunglasses please.

COMMUNICATION

You are a very important part of our program, for you are your child's first teacher. It is important that we exchange ideas and information because you can teach us a great deal about your child. We are here for the children, so it is essential that we know about exceptional circumstances in your child's life. Anything that might tend to affect your child certainly concerns us (family illnesses, death of a family member or pet, accidents, divorces, moving, etc.). Your privacy will be respected. Good communication is essential in order for our relationship to be the most effective.

If you have any concerns, please talk with your child's teacher and the director. **We cannot help with your concerns if we do not know what they are.** The director has an open door policy and invites you to share both praises and problems.

Newsletters: You will receive a weekly newsletter via email from your child's teacher to inform you of what is taking place in the classroom. Please look for important dates and information in these letters. This way, you will be able to talk with your child specifically about things that he/she is doing in school.

School Calendar: You will receive a monthly calendar with important dates.

Email/Text Communication: The preschool office communicates via a google group (CKPKfamilies@googlegroups.com) and utilizes Remind.com for important messages and reminders. Some classes use Remind.com, Bloomz or other apps to communicate to parents.

Remind.com is a free, safe, and simple messaging tool to share important messages with parents. All personal information is kept private. This is the fastest way we can communicate reminders, school closings, and urgent news with you.

Communication Folders: Students will be given a Communication folder to bring to school every day. It should be placed in the largest section of the backpack. The communication folder will be used for written correspondence, art work, tuition envelopes, etc. Please check the folder daily and return to school daily. Please do not place items in the pockets of the backpack.

CURRICULUM

In our program, your child will be offered many opportunities to grow, learn, and develop new skills through our own theme-based, Christian curriculum. Units are age-appropriate using creative play activities and hands-on learning activities. Activities encompass language development, fine and gross motor skills, art and music, practical life skills, nature and science, and social and emotional growth.

One of the most important parts of the preschool curriculum is providing an environment in which children grow in self-confidence and self-esteem. Children must feel good about themselves and know that God, Jesus, and Cornerstone Kids' staff love them.

Temporary Restriction: Chapel, Music and Movement and Library classes will be held in the classrooms. No book check-out temporarily.



Bible stories are taught in each class. We teach one Bible story and Bible verse each month. The three year olds, four year olds, and kindergarteners begin each morning reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and the Lord's Prayer and attend Chapel once a week. Chapel is led by the Pastor, Children's Ministry Director, or Preschool Director.

Library is offered for story time and book check-out. Students may check out one book at a time. If a library book is not returned, a reminder notice will be sent home. If a library book is lost or damaged, we ask that parents replace or pay the cost of the book.

Music and Movement class is offered in the music room. All children attend music and movement, and curriculum is age-appropriate.

Ones Program

The one-year-old program focuses primarily on speech, music and art. This is usually the first time that a child is away from Mommy and Daddy, and is vitally important in beginning a positive school attitude. This program utilizes verbalization and gross motor skills in each activity. The one-year-old class is the most unstructured of the classes at Cornerstone Kids focusing on play as a learning tool. A child entering this class must be one before September 1st, walking, and able to eat finger foods and drink from a sippy-cup. This program is offered 2 days a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Twos Program

The two-year-old program builds on using play as a learning tool. The children will also have a short circle time and table time along with teacher-directed play. Emphasis is on sharing, taking turns, verbalization, gross and fine motor skills. Basic colors, shapes and counting are also introduced.

We offer these options for two-year old classes:

- a two-day class that meets on Tuesdays and Thursdays
- a three-day class that meets on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays

Threes Program

The three-year-old program continues with skills introduced in the two-year-old program, but more in-depth. Circle and table times are longer. Teacher-directed play is more defined with children following simple two or three step instructions. Along with colors, shapes, counting and prewriting skills, the alphabet is introduced and name recognition begins.

We offer these options for three-year old classes:

- a two-day class that meets on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- a three-day class that meets on Mondays, Wednesday, and Fridays
- a three-day class that meets on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays
- a four-day class that meets on Monday, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays

Fours Program

The four-year-old program is one of the more structured classes at Cornerstone Kids. Although teacher directed play is utilized, more table and circle times are used. Emphasis is on name, letter, and number recognition. Teachers utilize the *Learning without Tears* curriculum, which includes *Get Set for School* for language, literacy and math skills and *Handwriting without Tears* for early handwriting skills. We also use the *Second Step* program which teaches children to recognize and manage their feelings and develop attention, focus and listening skills. The goal of the four-year-old program is to prepare the child for a positive year in kindergarten.

We offer these options for four-year old classes:

- a four day, 4 hour class that meets on Mondays – Thursdays
- a five day, 3 hour class that meets on Mondays – Fridays

Kindergarten Program

The Cornerstone Kids kindergarten program follows the Georgia Performance Standards and the GKIDS requirement for students. Our kindergarten program utilizes the *Foundations Curriculum* for phonics and early reading skills, *Weekly Reader* for science and social studies, and *Hands-On Standards* for math. The kindergarten students attend 4 field trips to maximize their learning experience. The goal of the kindergarten class is to prepare the child for a positive year in first grade. The kindergarten class meets Monday – Thursday, 9:00am – 1:00pm and Friday 9:00am – Noon. Students bring a lunch to eat at school.

Temporary Restriction: Field Trips have been temporarily suspended.

Temporary Restrictions: Please refer to the Covid-19 Policies and Procedures Handbook.

HEALTH

In an effort to protect all of our children from the spread of contagious illnesses, please keep your child at home if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

Fever above 100.4 degrees	Runny nose with thick, colored mucus
Earache	Nausea/Vomiting
Sore throat	Skin Rash
Diarrhea	Pink, red or swollen eyes
Cough, trouble breathing	Headache

Your child must be symptom free and fever free without medication for 48* hours before returning to school.

**72 hours symptom and fever free without medication and 11 days since symptoms occurred for Covid-19 diagnosis*

We work hard at school to keep your child safe and healthy by washing hands frequently, encouraging students to cover mouth with a tissue or elbow when sneezing/coughing, and sanitizing, and cleaning tables and toys.

In order to best meet your child's educational/medical needs, please notify the director if

- your child has been diagnosed with a contagious illness
- your child has allergies or any special needs
- you have concerns about your child's development

If medication is to be given at school, please fill out the medication form and have it signed by the doctor. All students who have a prescription for an Epi-Pen will be given an Allergy Action form to be completed and signed by a doctor. Medications are stored in a locked medicine bag and kept in the class emergency bag (which travels with the class).

INCLEMENT WEATHER

If Coweta County Schools close or have a delay, Cornerstone Kids Preschool will be closed. We will notify parents using Remind.com and email. Any days missed due to inclement weather will not be made up nor will tuition or Lunch Buddy refunds be given.

IMMUNIZATION RECORD

The Georgia Department of Health requires that we have a current Immunization Form on file **BEFORE** your child can attend school. Immunization Form 3231 is due on your child's first day of school. No exceptions. This form may be obtained from your pediatrician or the public health department. If your child's immunization expires during the school year, please submit an updated form 3231 within one week of the expiration date.

INSURANCE

Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten is covered by liability insurance in the amount required by the State of Georgia.

LUNCH BUDDY

Temporarily suspended due to Covid-19 Restrictions

Lunch Buddy is an optional service offered by our teachers Monday–Thursday from 12:00p.m.–1:00p.m. The children bring their lunch from home and eat and play. When the weather is nice, the children will play outside on the playground. In inclement weather, they will play inside. There is no educational instruction during Lunch Buddy. This extension of the day is a fun, social-time for children that have already adjusted to school and do not need an early afternoon nap. The fee is \$6/day or \$25 for a bundle of 5 tags. Parents or guests will not be allowed to eat lunch with students during Lunch Buddy.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

In the event of a medical emergency, every possible effort will be made to contact you immediately. Teachers and staff are CPR and First Aid trained.

Please notify the director and your child’s teachers in writing of any allergies or medical diagnosis your child may have. We will make an “action” plan specific to your child.

PERSONAL TOYS

Children should not bring toys and items to which they are personally attached (“blankies”, stuffed animals, pacifiers, etc.) from home unless they have been requested to do so by the teacher, for show and tell, or another special event. The classroom is a place where children learn to share toys and take turns. It is better for children to play with school toys in a shared setting. Playing with school toys minimizes personal disappointment when a toy breaks. Personal items that interfere with learning will be placed in your child’s backpack.

SECURITY

Keeping children safe is a priority at Cornerstone Kids Preschool and Kindergarten. All exterior doors remained locked during preschool hours.

If you have given written permission for someone new (to us) to pick up your child, then please inform them that they will need a picture ID. We will check the ID. If there is ever any question in our minds, we will not release your child until we have contacted you for verification.

Each student will also be issued a bag tag that must remain on his/her book bag at all times. The bag tag provides a list of authorized persons to pick up your child as well as a list of emergency contact numbers. Changes to the bag tag need to be made in writing and given to the director.

WE WILL NOT RELEASE YOUR CHILD TO ANYONE OTHER THAN PARENTS UNLESS WRITTEN PERMISSION IS GIVEN IN ADVANCE.

Temporary Restriction: Snack

SNACKS

You will be assigned certain dates to bring healthy snacks for your child's class for the week. All snacks must be **store bought**, pre-packaged and unopened. You may provide bags/boxes in bulk quantities or individually wrapped. Please do not send cookies, candy or chips. Please remember to send utensils, if needed. Classrooms have a refrigerator for cold snacks.

Temporary Restriction: Water Fountains Closed

NEW: All children should bring **water** in a non-spill sippy cup labeled with child's name. Please do not send juice, milk, etc. as sugary drinks spill and attract ants. We will have disposable cups available for water.

If you have questions about a snack, please check with your child's teacher. If a child has a food allergy, we will communicate with parents the type of food not allowed for snack.

Students in the 4B (4-day fours) and Kindergarten classes will eat lunch midway through the day. Please send a packed lunch, including water in a spill-proof container. Please only send water as spilled juice attracts ants and these rooms are carpeted.

SOCIAL MEDIA

We have several children in our program whose parents do not want their child's picture posted on social media (Facebook, Instagram, etc.), so please be mindful of uploading pictures from school events. If you have other children's faces in your pictures, edit them out or talk to the parents before posting. Some children's safety depends on this!

TRANSPORTATION CHANGES

All transportation changes must be made in writing. If someone new/different is picking up your child from school, please send a note in the communication folder or contact the office and let us know the name and phone number of the person picking up your child. Please inform them that they will need a picture ID. We will check the ID. If there is ever any question in our minds, we will not release your child until we have contacted you for verification.

*Pre-K 4 students have a one-time curriculum fee of \$50.00 due May 15th.

**Kindergarten students have a one-time curriculum fee of \$100.00 due May 15th and a one-time enrichment fee of \$100 that is due the June 15th.

Members of Cornerstone UMC receive a \$10 tuition discount each month.

Siblings will receive a \$10.00 tuition discount for each additional child.

Tuition is due on the 15th of each month for months August - April. Payments options:

1. **Cash** (exact change only) or **check** payable to Cornerstone Kids. Please put the cash or check in the tuition envelope provided each month and return to school in the communication folder.
2. **Bill Pay:** You can utilize your bank's billpay to send us a check. Please address check to CKPK and list your child's name in the memo. All checks should be mailed to:

Please let us know if you wish to pay using your bank's bill pay program. We will not send the tuition envelope home.
3. **Online:** You may pay online at <https://cornerstoneumc.com/ckpk/pay-online/>. Please note that a \$6 convenience fee is added to cover the costs of the online service. If paying online, please write "*Paid Online*" on the tuition envelope for the month paid and return to school.

Tuition not received by the 20th of the month is considered late and a \$20 late fee will be added. For your benefit, the yearly tuition rate is prorated over a nine-month payment schedule (August – April), and the same amount is due each month.

The registration fee is the same as one month's tuition and due at registration. There is no discount for the registration fee as this is used to cover classroom supplies for the year. Registration fees are non-refundable.

Students with an unpaid balance after 30 days are subject to removal from program. Withdrawal of your child's enrollment in our school requires a 30 day written notice or one month's tuition payment. Registration fees are non-refundable.

Temporary Restriction - Visitors, including parents, and other church staff members will not be allowed in the preschool wing unless previously authorized by CKPK Preschool Administration or Senior Pastor.

VISITORS

During preschool hours, all visitors to the church and preschool are asked to enter through the office door, sign-in and receive a visitor sticker. The visitor clipboard is located under the mail box outside of the preschool office door. Please place a visitor sticker on your shirt.

While we certainly welcome all parents, we do have safety policies in place in the church and preschool. We ask that if parents would like to observe a child in the classroom, please contact the director to make an appointment. Parents or guests will not be allowed to eat lunch with students during Lunch Buddy.
